

# Prevent smuggling of cash: DEO

### Rose directs ROs to submit seizure-related information every day

FLYING squad teams have to play a major role in conducting the elections in Hyderabad in a smooth and transparent manner and checks should be carried out efficiently. Hyderabad District Electoral Officer (DEO) D Ronald Rose told at a training programme for flying squads and SSTs at the GHMC head office here on Thursday.

Rose said checks should be carried out to prevent illegal movement of cash and liquor. Besides, gold, silver and freebies should be seized and relevant information should be submitted to the DEO by the RO every day, he said.

The flying squads must enter the election-related seizure details like the location from where the seizures are made and the name of the officers concerned through the ESMS application on a daily basis. He said this information will be conveyed by the FST head to the nodal officer and enforcement officers concerned. Later, this application should be used to get information from banks to cash transport vehicles through QR code. Flying squads should check the certificates and release the cash and goods not related to the elections.

## CAPF, RPF teams to assist flying squads: ACP



Additional Commissioner of Police Vikram Singh Mann said CAPF and RPF teams will also work alongside the flying squads. He asked the officials to ensure that no campaign is carried out at places of worship. Loudspeakers are banned from 10 pm to 6 am as part of election campaign. If citizens ask for videos related to the cash seized by the flying squads, they will be sent a copy granted they pay a ₹300 fee, he said, adding that people should be treated politely

## CCTVs to be set up at DRC centres

TO safeguard Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) and other polling machinery at the 15 Distribution, Reception and Counting (DRC) centres in Hyderabad during the ensuing Telangana Assembly elections, the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) has proposed to procure CCTV cameras which would be installed in 15 Returning Officers (ROs) and 15 DRC centres until the elections conclude.

The civic body has invited bids for supply, installation, configuration, commissioning and maintenance of cameras for the ensuring elections. The selected bidder will have to integrate configuration with all sites in local office, head office and mobiles of department officials.



It was earlier reported that to maintain security, a three-tier system will be in place. Each DRC will be supervised by an Assistant Commissioner of Police-rank officer, and the city security wing will be deployed at every centre for access control.

# Contract killer held for extortion

A man, Vanarasi Yadagiri, lodged a complaint with the police after the man, Mohammad Khaizer, whom he had hired to kill his rivals in 2016, refused to honour the contract and blackmailed him in return. Khaizer was arrested and remanded into custody.

According to the police, Khaizer had initially accepted a proposal from Yadagiri to eliminate his rivals, who were allegedly involved in the murder of his brother, Vanarasi Raju, in 2016. Khaizer received photographs of the intended targets from Yadagiri and demanded a sum of ₹2 lakh to carry out the task. Khaizer collected the agreed-upon amount. However, he failed to execute the task and postponed it using excuses.

Subsequently, when Yadagiri requested the return of his money, Khaizer began to threaten him, demanding ₹4 lakh. Khaizer warned Yadagiri that he would face harm if he failed to comply with this demand. Recently, Yadagiri, filed complaint against Khaizer for his extortions, criminal conspiracy to commit murder, and threats.

# GRP & RPF recover stolen ammunition

THE Government Railway Police (GRP) and Railway Protection Force (RPF) has arrested a 21-year-old labourer in connection with the theft of ammunition that took place at Secunderabad Railway Station. On October 24, a backpack containing 60 INAS rounds, three magazines, and their pouch were reported stolen from a Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) constable.

After review of CCTV footage, the accused, Nakkeni Ananda Murthy, was identified and subsequently apprehended at a Metro station area. However, the stolen ammunition was not found in his possession.

On verification of nearly 100 cameras, Rachamalla Satyanarayana, who had picked up the pouch during his morning walk, was identified and the ammunition was recovered.

# Dilsukhnagar blasts convict gets 10 yr in prison

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) court in New Delhi, on Thursday, sentenced Syed Maqbool to 10 years of imprisonment for his role in the 2013 Dilsukhnagar blast, in which 18 persons were killed and 131 were injured. He was convicted under Sections 38(2) and 39(2) of the UA(P) Act. Ten others connected to the case were convicted in March and July this year. "Syed Maqbool of Nanded, Maharashtra, was arrested in the case on February 28, 2013, for his active involvement with members of the Indian Mujahideen based in Pakistan and India, and his involvement in

the crime and conspiracy. It has been revealed that he maintained close ties with key figures of the Indian Mujahideen, including Riyaz Bhatkal in Pakistan, and Imran Khan and Obaid-Ur-Rehman in India. They conspired to carry out explosive attacks at various locations in India, with Hyderabad as a primary target. Extensive reconnaissance of important sites, including those in Hyderabad, was also conducted," a statement by the NIA read.

The case is related to a conspiracy by members of the Indian Mujahideen, a group responsible for a series of

devastating blasts across the country, the NIA added.

These acts of terror include the Varanasi blasts on March 7, 2006, the Mumbai serial blasts on July 11, 2006, the UP courts serial blasts in Varanasi, Faizabad, and Lucknow on November 23, 2007, the Hyderabad twin blasts on August 25, 2007, the Jaipur serial blasts in 2008, the Delhi serial blasts in 2008, the Ahmedabad serial blasts on July 26, 2008, the Chinnaswamy Stadium blast in Bengaluru in 2010 and the Hyderabad twin blasts in 2013.

# No headway in SR Nagar murder case

SR Nagar police are yet to catch the prime accused in the recent student murder at Sasaram Basti in SR Nagar. While sources stated that police have taken the suspect into custody, the officials have denied the claim.

According to the police, a rowdy sheeter, Mohammad Shareed, killed P Tarun, a student, over a dispute. The cops believe that Shareed asked Tarun to meet him in a secluded place and killed him.

A police officer said there are no clues yet. They were eyewitness to the murder and the statements of several witnesses from the locality and onlookers were recorded, the officer said, adding that they are analysing CCTV footage for leads.

Khan, and Obaid-ur-Rahman — were found guilty under Sections 18, 19, 38(2), and 39(2) of the UA(P) Act in the Indian Mujahideen conspiracy case and were sentenced to 10 years of imprisonment.

Additionally, in August, Yasin Bhatkal, Asadullah Akhter, Zia-ur-Rahman, Tehsin Akhter and Hyder Ali were sentenced by the NIA Special Court in New Delhi under Sections 121 and 122 of the IPC, as well as Sections 17, 18, 19, 21, 38, 39, and 40 of the UA(P) Act.

While a total of 11 persons have been convicted in the case, the trial of the remaining six accused persons is ongoing, the statement said.
